One year since the historic Paris Agreement, the sixth biennial C40 Mayors Summit brings together world-leading mayors to advance a common agenda of inclusive urban growth and a climate-safe future, playing a key role in delivering the Paris Agreement's ambition of limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius. Working together, C40 mayors are driving low-carbon and resilient economies that improve the health, opportunities and wellbeing of urban citizens.
